Get-To-Know-Me Question:

What is the craziest thing you have either talked someone into doing or that you have been talked into doing?

Into-the-Bible Questions:

Read through **Joshua 6:1-5.**

1. What part of this strategic attack makes sense? Why would God give Joshua a plan of attack like this to carry out against his enemies?
2. Put yourself in Joshua's shoes. How would you go about casting a vision like this to the people that look to you for leadership?
3. If you were to read through the rest of the chapter you would notice two things: no one questions Joshua about the plans and everything happens exactly as God said it would (v20). What does this tell us about Joshua's character? What does this show us about the character of God?

Let's Go Deeper:

Read through **2 Chronicles 2:1-9.**

1. Based on what you know about Solomon, how do you think he came to the decision to build this new Temple to honor God?
2. Chapter 3 walks us through the details of how the Temple was constructed. Do you think everyone under Solomon's authority could envision the Temple layout as clearly as he could? What would be a fair way for the people to respond to his plans?
3. If we were to read through the next few chapters of 2 Chronicles, we would see that the Temple was grand. It is clear from all the materials that went into this effort that no expense was spared. Do you think everyone in the kingdom was on board with Solomon's vision for the Temple? Why or why not?
4. Based on Sunday's message, 2 Chronicles 2, and Joshua 6, where does vision come from and how is it cast and carried out?
